

Wright appointed VP of rural economic development board

JAMES WRIGHT, Midwest Energy's key accounts and member services manager, was recently installed as vice president of the Western Kansas Rural Economic Development Alliance (WKREDA). This coalition of people in 55 western Kansas counties seek to improve the lives of residents in those areas by serving as an economic development resource.

The organization is governed by a 12-member Board of Directors, with subcommittees focused on agriculture, community development, legislative, marketing, professional development, and workforce.

Wright has represented Midwest Energy as a member of WKREDA since 2017.

"I have large shoes to fill, but everyone in the organization seems to step up and help each other out so that Western Kansas as a whole benefits from our effort," Wright said.

In this leadership position, Wright will assist the WKREDA president with the planning of quarterly conferences as well as an annual conference. After his one-year term as vice president, Wright will transition to the role of president in 2022.
